This creates a relationship between the art, the player, and its meaning radically different from all previous art forms. This book builds around this central premise with examinations of related subjects pertaining to video game meaning-making, such as the ways in which video games facilitate play that is expressive of their players and the ways in which it is appropriate to compare and contextualize the differences in players' instantiated play activities. These subjects are designed to give readers an in-depth understanding of the dynamics of gameplay in order to facilitate richer, more meaningful encounters with video games as cultural artifacts.
