Tuchman's observations about the irrational escalation of conflict made a deep impression on President John F. Kennedy and influenced his actions during the Cuban Missile Crisis; fifty years later, *The Guns of August* remains an exemplary study of events propelled headlong by their own internal logic and momentum.
